


What Happened?

- March 10, 2019
- Early morning fire at Lake Bloomington Parks Maintenance Building
- Building, vehicles, equipment, and contents were a total loss
- Investigated by Mutual Aid Box Alarm System 41
- Cause undeterminable

New Maintenance Facility Funding Breakdown

Estimated Total Cost: \$1.2 million



*Total to be finalized during insurance claim process



Build Larger Facility Closer to Treatment Plant

- Fully secures plant by incorporating fence around new building and two wells
- Allows Department to include \$493,000 of items from the draft Water Master Plan into the new building
- Relocates Park Ranger's office to provide a central location and removes the existing office (costly to repair)
- Relocates Property Manager's office to provide a central location

- Provides more space close to Davis Lodge for parking or other functions
- Improves the Davis Lodge viewshed, which could encourage more bookings
- Public meeting room that removes the need to meet inside the water treatment plant
- Consolidates and improves facility functions
