

FAQ - CATERING & SECONDARY PREMISE LIQUOR LICENSES

- 1. Do I need a City of Bloomington license if I am interested in catering food only?
 - No, serving <u>food only does not</u> require a City of Bloomington license. However, a McLean County Health Permit is required.
- 2. Do I need a City of Bloomington license if I am interested in catering <u>food and liquor</u> or <u>liquor only</u>?
 - Yes...
 - Bloomington businesses holding a Class EA, EB, TA, TB, RA, RB, PA, or PB City of Bloomington Primary Liquor License must get a <u>Secondary Premise Liquor License</u> to serve/sell liquor at any premise other than their primary licensed premise. If approved, they can serve/sell liquor by individual drink, bottle, and/or open bar. Food is not required to also be served.
 - Out-of-Town businesses holding a Primary Liquor License from a municipality other than Bloomington must get a City of Bloomington <u>Catering Liquor License</u> to serve liquor in Bloomington. If approved, they can <u>only serve liquor via open bar and food must also be served.</u>
- 3. What is the difference between a Catering Liquor License and a Secondary Premise Liquor License?
 - Catering Liquor Licenses are strictly for <u>out-of-town businesses</u> holding a Primary Liquor License from a municipality outside of Bloomington. A City of Bloomington Catering Liquor License, if approved, requires that <u>food be served</u> and that <u>liquor only be provided via an open bar</u>. <u>Individual drink and/or bottle sales are not allowed</u>.
 - **Secondary Premise Liquor Licenses** are for Bloomington businesses holding a Class EA, EB, TA, TB, RA, RB, PA, or PB City of Bloomington Primary Liquor License who wish to sell/serve liquor at a location other than their primary licensed premise.
- 4. Can I operate a mobile bar in the City of Bloomington?
 - Mobile bars are only allowed to be operated by City of Bloomington Primary Liquor License holders who have applied for and received a City of Bloomington Secondary Premise Liquor License for each event and location where the mobile bar will be operated.
