Response Time Analysis

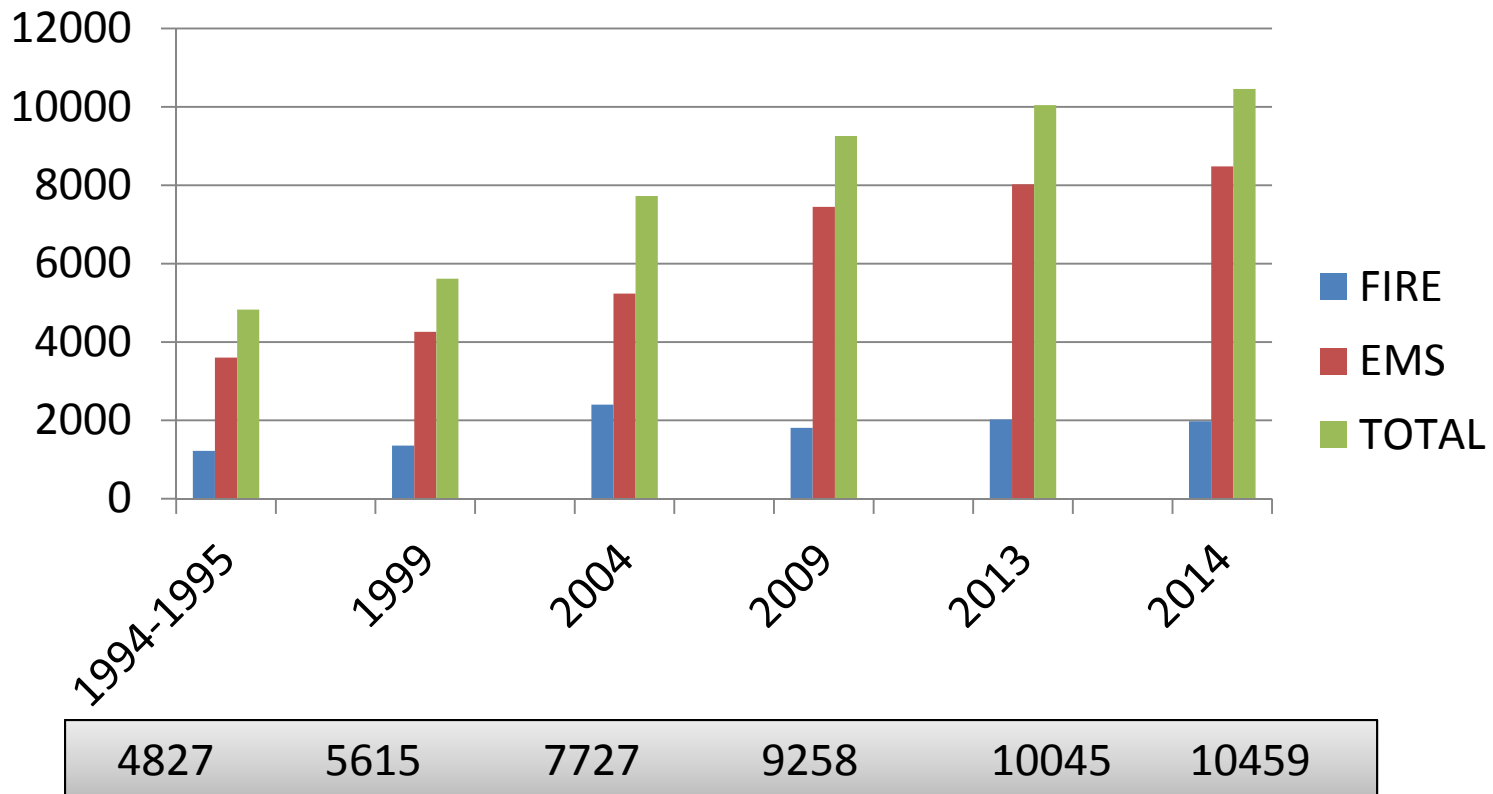
NFPA 1710 is a standard concerning personnel deployment and response times to fires and medical emergencies

6 Minute Response Time

Fire Response – 72.8 %
Structure Fires – 82.5%
EMS – 67.1 %

90 % Percentile Times

Fire = 8 minutes
EMS = 9 minutes

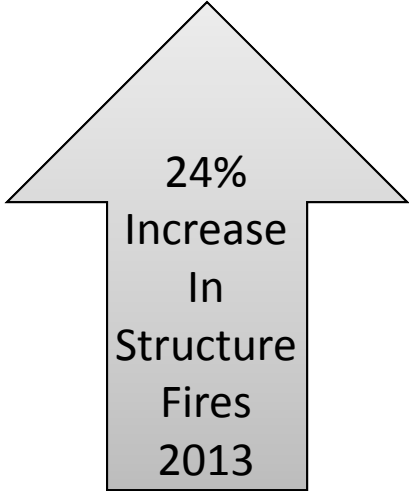


26% increase in call volume from 2004 – 2014

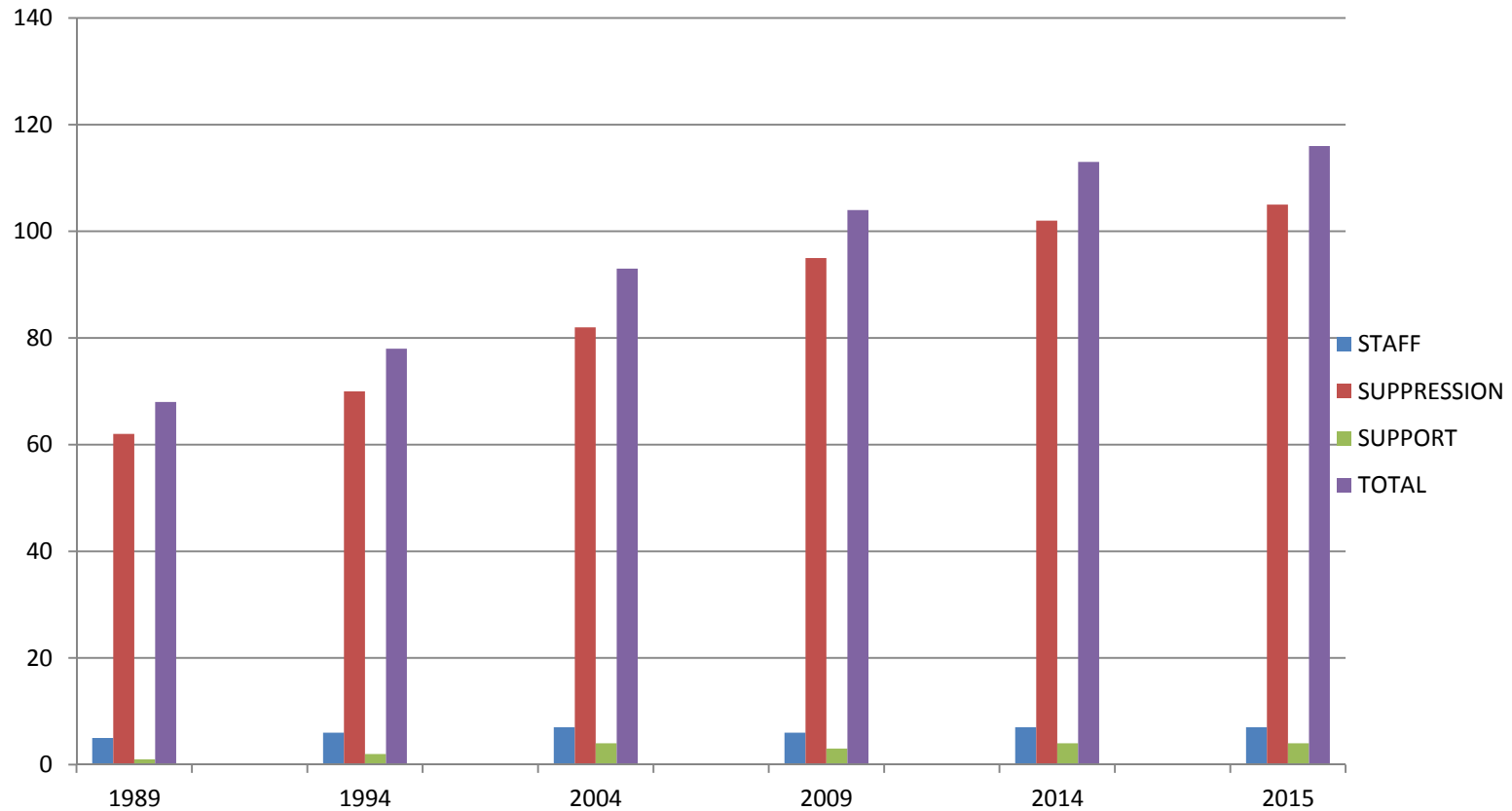

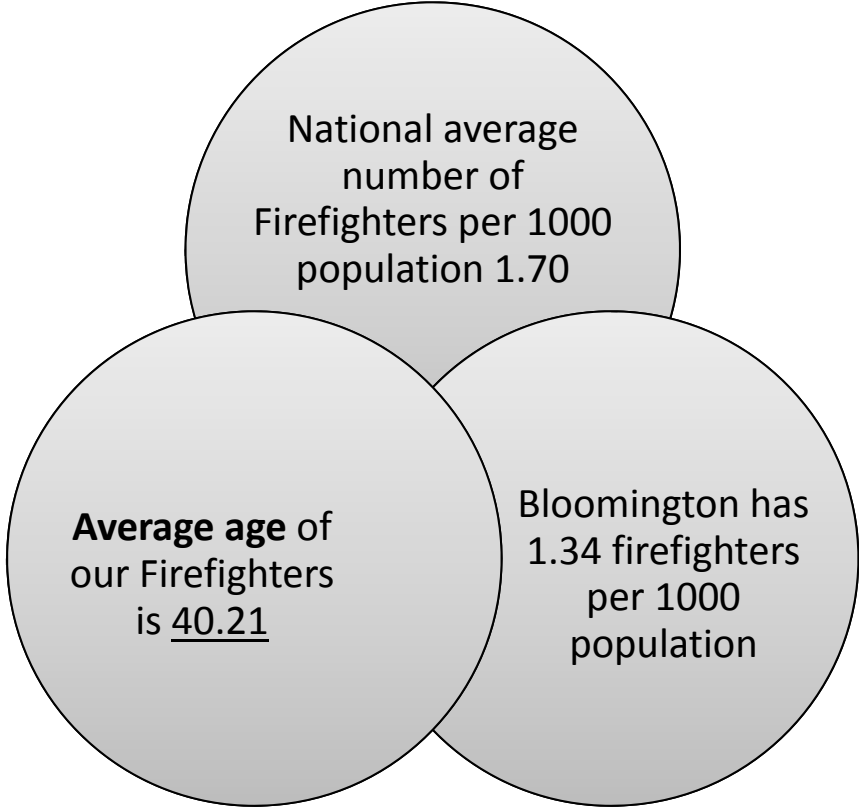
BLOOMINGTON FIRE DEPARTMENT STAFFING OVER THE YEARS

2016 Focus

- Develop new agreement with Central Illinois Regional Airport
- Collaborate with Normal FD on shared Automatic Vehicle Location (iChiefs)
- Enable video conferencing and distance learning capabilities in all Station training rooms
- Update City of Bloomington Emergency Operation Plan
- Complete the Firehouse Reporting Software upgrade
- Update Run Cards for improved response using New Priority Dispatch System (ISO)
- Integration of Pre-plan information with the CAD to support responding units
- Exhaust removal systems to increase the safety and wellness (Faithful & Gould)
- Institute a Health and Wellness Initiative to decrease on the Job injuries



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Future Needs

- Traffic Preemption
- Additional Ambulance to reduce response times
- Reinstate Engine Company at Station 3
- Acquire future Station location Northeast
- Electronic Patient Care Reporting system to increase the efficiency and accuracy of Reports
- Create a long term plan to address capitol Station improvements
